Entries will be accepted in the order in which they are completed on line or postmarked and received. Entries will not be accepted by phone. Entries must be postmarked on or after the opening date and up to and including the closing date. Entries received after the closing date will be charged a \$30 Post-Entry Fee. Payment to Lake Erie College is due with entries. Cash, check, and credit cards are accepted. Online payments made through Horse Spot. Entries must have payment to be accepted. Stalls will be assigned on a first-come, first-served basis. Day stalls will be assigned only if available. Stabling may be limited. The Show Committee reserves the right to limit entries, modify the classes per horse, add, divide, or cancel classes, or make necessary changes as required by the circumstances of the competition. The rider must sign each entry, or an adult must sign each entry if the rider is a minor

There are permanent box stalls and vinyl temporary stalls with doors (minimum 10 x 10) under a permanent roof. Stallions, horses over 17 hands, and entries showing for the entire weekend will be given preference for permanent stalls. Please pre-order shavings on your entry form. REFUNDS:

NO REFUNDS ON STABLING FEES OR OFFICE FEES. Before the closing date, class entry fees will be refunded. After the closing date, entry fees will only be refunded with a certificate of illness or injury prepared by an accredited veterinarian and presented to the secretary before the start of the show. Entry fees are non-refundable for any reason after the show begins, including in the event of class cancellations due to severe weather, power outages, or force majeure.

COGGINS and VACCINES:

A certificate of negative Coggins listing the horse's recorded show name (within 12 months of the show date) is required. Proof of vaccination showing immunization for Equine Influenza and Equine Herpes Virus within 6 months of the show date is required. Show numbers and stabling will not be issued without a current Coggins and proof of vaccination.

FORCE MAJEURE:

In the event of a force majeure, this competition may be subject to cancellation. "Force Majeure" shall mean fire, earthquake, flood, snow, ice, lightning, act of God, the presence of contagious or infectious disease among humans (for example but not limited to COVID-19) or animals (for example but not limited to EHV 1/4 or strangles), work stoppages or other labor disturbances, riots or civil commotions, litigation, war or other act of foreign nation, power of government, or governmental agency or authority, or any other cause like or unlike any cause above mentioned which is beyond the control of the show management. In the event of cancellation before the show begins due to force majeure, all fees paid by competitors will be refunded in full.

CLASS DESCRIPTION:

To be ridden by Junior/Amateur riders. Open to ponies and horses. Riders will navigate a traditional hunter-type course, which may include banks, ditches, in-and-out lines, and bending lines. Each rider will compete at their designated height (2'3", 2'6", and 2'9"), and the entire class will be pinned as one. Round 1 will be similar to a hunter classic-type course. The top 10 finishers in round 1 will return to be judged in round 2. Round 2 will be a handy hunter-type course. Ribbons will be given through 6th place. 50% of the total entry money will be divided among the top four places (40%, 30%, 20%, 10%).

22. THE SCHNEIDERS SADDLERY OPEN PERFORMANCE HUNTER DERBY

CLASS DESCRIPTION:

Riders will navigate a traditional hunter-type course, which may include banks, ditches, in-and-out lines, and bending lines. Each rider will compete at their designated height (3', 3'3", 3'6"), and the entire class will be pinned as one. Round 1 will be similar to a hunter classic-type course. The top 10 placed in round 1 will return to be judged in round 2. Round 2 will be a handy hunter-type course. Ribbons will be given through 6th place. 50% of the total entry money will be divided among the top four places (40%, 30%, 20%, 10%).

The President's Cup *New Class*

31. THE PRESIDENT'S CUP

CLASS DESCRIPTION:

The president's cup is a team equitation class open to amateur riders. Each team will be made up of a 2', 2'3", and 2'6" rider. All riders jump and be numerically scored. All riders will come back and flat with their section. Riders demonstrate skill at walking, trotting, and cantering. This class will include testing. The judge will numerically score each rider in the flat classes. Numerical scores will be added up to determine placings.

2' test 1-6 (Rider 1)

2'3" test 1-9 (Rider 2)

2'6" test 1-13 (Rider 3)

1. Ask an appropriate question.
2. Halt.
3. Sitting Trot.
4. Two-point position at the walk and/or trot.
5. Figure eight at trot, demonstrating change of diagonals.
6. Figure eight at canter on correct lead, demonstrating simple change of lead.
7. Ride without stirrups. Riders must be given the option to cross their irons.
8. Change leads on a straight line, demonstrating simple change of lead.
9. Change horses.
10. Canter on the counter lead. No more than eight horses may counter canter at one time.
11. Half-turn on forehand and/or half turn on haunches.
12. Jump a shortened course.
13. Trot a jump not to exceed 2' 6"

- All Jumper Classes will be held in accordance with USEF, OPHA, and Zone 5 Specifications.
- All ties for first place will be called back to compete in a jump-off.
- Ties for other than first place will be broken by the time taken in the first round.
- Emerging Team: .75
- Low Team: .85
- High Team: 1.0

Nations Cup (Prix de Nations) scoring show jumping scoring system: the lowest cumulative penalty points across two rounds to determine the winning team, with four riders per team. The top three cumulative scores from each team are added together. Class will utilize USEF scoring for faults and time penalties.

CLASS DESCRIPTION:

- Open to any horse
- A horse may be ridden on only one team.
- A team consists of four riders and four horses, with the three best scores to count.
- A fifth horse may be used as an alternate in case of injury to a horse during the first round. The alternate horse must be listed for the team before the competition begins.
- In the event of an injury to a horse or rider, a team can consist of three riders and three horses. The team will not have a drop score if the team only has three riders.
- Open to junior and amateur riders
- Each team may include only one professional rider
- Amateurs must present a current USEF Amateur Card
- A rider may ride on more than one team. However, the rider must ride a different horse.
- A limited number of individual entries will be accepted. From these entries, teams of four will be formed during the draw. Odd entries may compete individually. Entries may be limited

JUMPER TEAM AWARDS

The Ron Schwane Memorial Sportsmanship Award will go to a Prix de Villes participant who shows compassion, kindness, and humor. Nominations for this award will come from others, and nominees will submit a short example of these traits along with their favorite memory of Ron. The winner will be announced during the team awards. We hope to keep his spirit alive by perpetuating kindness and the sense of community and family that he gave us for so many years.

CLASS INFORMATION:

HUNTER AND EQUITATION CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

- **Hunter Over Fences:** To be shown over approximately eight fences at the required height. To be judged on performance over the jumps and way of going.
- **Hunter Under Saddle:** To be shown at a walk, trot, and canter. Light contact with the horse's mouth is required. Martingales are not permitted.
- **Blue Ribbon/Red Ribbon Schooling Hunter:** Horses and ponies will be judged and given a numeric score. Scores of 77-100 will earn a blue ribbon. Scores of 70-76 will earn a red ribbon.
- **Blue/Red classes** will remain open all day in front of hunter classes. There is no limit on the number of times a rider/horse combination can enter this class, time permitting. Fence heights will be set according to what is shown at the time.
- **Equitation on the Flat:** Riders demonstrate skill at walking, trotting, and cantering. Classes may include testing.

HUNTER CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

- **Low Adult Hunter:** Open to amateur riders. Cross-entry between the Low Adult section and the Amateur-Owner section is prohibited. Riders may not cross-enter into any class or section at the same competition where fences exceed 2'9". Fences 2'6".
- **Low Adult Flat Equitation:** Open to all riders eligible for the Low Adult Hunter section.
- **Adult Amateur Hunter:** Horses to be ridden by amateurs. Riders may not compete in any other classes at the same competition where fences exceed 3'5" (Equitation, Jumper classes 1.20 m and lower, Amateur Owner Hunter, Amateur-Owner Jumper classes). Any rider showing in the Amateur-Owner Hunter or Amateur-Owner Jumper division may compete with 1 different horse in the Adult Amateur Hunter division and must own or have a USEF lease of said horse. Fences 2'9" to 3', spreads not to exceed fence heights. Ponies may be shown by adults.
- **Adult Amateur Flat Equitation:** Open to all riders eligible for the Adult Amateur Hunter section.
- **Children's Hunter:** To be ridden by a junior exhibitor. Riders may not cross-enter into any class in which fences exceed 3'5" at the same show (Exception: Equitation classes up to 3'9", Jumper classes 1.20 m and lower, Junior Hunter sections). Fences 2'9" to 3', spreads not to exceed fence height.
- **Children's Flat Equitation:** Open to all riders eligible for the Children's Hunter section.
- **Junior/Amateur Owner Hunter:** Horses to be ridden by a Junior rider or an Amateur Owner, per OPHA/WPaPHA rules. Fences 3'3".
- **Junior/Amateur-Owner Flat Equitation:** Open to all riders eligible for the Junior/Amateur Owner Hunter section. Low
- **Children's Hunter:** To be ridden by a junior exhibitor. Riders may not cross-enter into any class on the same horse in which fences exceed 2'6" or in any class where fences exceed 3' 3. Fence Height 2'6"
- **Low Children's Flat Equitation:** Open to all riders eligible for the Low Children's Hunter section.
- **Low Hunter:** Open to any horse rider combination. All classes will be judged on performance & soundness. Fence Height 2'9" to 3'.
- **Short Stirrup Hunter:** Open to riders 12 years of age and under. Riders aged 12 who are eligible for Short Stirrup under OPHA rules may earn points for Short Stirrup in the Limit Rider division only at 7 shows where the Short Stirrup division is limited to riders 11 years old and under, as long as the rest of the division specifications match. Fences 2', oxers, and in & outs not permitted.
- **Short Stirrup Equitation on the Flat:** Open to riders eligible for the Short Stirrup Hunter division. Riders

aged 12 who are eligible for Short Stirrup Equitation on the Flat under OPHA rules may earn points for this class in the Limit Rider Equitation on the Flat only at shows where this class is limited to riders 11 years old and under, as long as the rest of the class specifications match.

- **Limit Rider:** Available for horses or riders with limited experience. Fence Height 2' (oxers not permitted).
- **Limit Rider Equitation on the Flat:** Open to all horses and riders eligible for the Limit Hunter section.
- **Novice Hunter:** Available for horse or rider with novice experience. Fence Height 2'0" to 2'3" (oxers not permitted).
- **Novice Hunter Under Saddle:** Open to all horses and riders eligible for the Novice Hunter section.
- **N.A.R.H.A. ADULT EQUITATION:** Open to all Amateur members. To be shown over a minimum of eight fences 2'9" to 3' in height, spread not to exceed fence height. The course may be either a hunter or jumper type and must include at least two changes of direction and a combination. Water obstacles are not permitted. A numerical score must be announced at the completion of the first round. The top four riders are required to return for further testing (USEF tests 1-19). Classes with fewer than 12 riders in the original class may have the test included in the original course. If a show does not offer the N.A.R.H.A. class, points in one class with corresponding specifications (e.g., Ariat Medal) will count as N.A.R.H.A. points.
- **MICHAEL RHEINHEIMER LOW CHILDREN'S/LOW ADULT MEDAL:** Open to riders eligible for the Low Children's and Low Adult Hunter sections. To be shown over a minimum of eight fences 2'6" in height, spreads not to exceed fence height, and must include at least two changes of direction. A numerical score must be announced at the completion of the first round. The top four riders are required to return for further testing (USEF tests 1-19). Classes with fewer than four riders in the original class may have the test included in the original course. If a show does not offer the Mike Rheinheimer Medal, points in one class with corresponding specifications will count as Mike Rheinheimer Medal points.
- **Leadline:** Open to children 8 years of age or under. May be asked to trot. Riders must be accompanied on a leadline by an adult. Riders may not be cross-entered in any other classes.

GENERAL INFORMATION

HUNTER DERBY - COURSE WALK AND SCHOOLING

Schooling in the warm-up ring only for the Hunter Derby. After the course is set for the Hunter Derby, 15 minutes will be offered for course walking, followed by 15 minutes of hand walking. Management may/will limit the number of schooling horses permitted in the warm-up ring at one time (e.x, timed sets of groups of horses).

JUMPER PRIX TEAM

- **ORDER OF GO** - Coaches must indicate the order of go for their teams on the entry blank. The team order of go will be determined by representatives or a show official, as drawn. Drawing will be held during the Parade of Teams. For the first round, the first rider from each team will go first, and so on. The order of go for the final round will be determined by the total team faults accumulated during the first round, and the team with the greatest number of faults will go first. For the second round, the number of teams may be limited to 8 teams per division, except where ties need to be broken.
- **AWARDS PRESENTATION** - A Formal Awards ceremony will be held on Sunday afternoon, following the last ride. The top 3 teams in each division are requested to participate on foot in show attire. The Charles E. Kinney Jumper Style Award will be presented during this time.
- **PARADE OF TEAMS** - The Parade of Teams will take place prior to the start of the Prix de Villes Team Jumper competition. All teams are asked to be present in full show attire. Photographs will be taken.

- **SCORING FOR TEAMS** - USEF Table 2.2(a). The best three performances out of four count for each team. Scores from both rounds will be totaled, and the team with the fewest faults will win.
- **TIES FOR TEAMS** - In case of equality of faults for first, second, or third place, one Junior or Amateur from each team in the tie(to be chosen by the coach) will compete in the jump-off. If there is an equality of faults in the jump off, the rider with the best time will win. Riders for all teams in the jump-off must be chosen before the first rider in the jump-off begins.
- **INDIVIDUAL CHAMPIONSHIPS** - The individual champion will be a Junior or Amateur rider who has accumulated the least number of faults in the two rounds of team competition. In case of ties for first, second, or third place, there will be a jump-off over a shortened course. In the event of equality of faults, time will be the deciding factor. If a rider competing for the individual championship is also chosen to break the tie for the team, they will only jump off once. That jump-off score will count as the individual and team score.

GENERAL SCHOOLING

OUTDOOR

The lighted outdoor arena will be open for lunging and flat schooling during show hours, weather permitting. The hunt field will be closed at all times.

INSPIRATION ARENA

Closed on Thursday night. This ring will have dividers to allow for longing, flat, and fences schooling in with various dragging breaks throughout the day.

WARM-UP

Schooling in the warm-up ring will be open on Thursday from 12:00 PM to 4:30 PM, with limited jumps available, and in the competition ring from 7:00 PM – 8:00 PM after the course is set.

COMPETITION RING

Friday schooling in the competition ring will take place from 8:00 AM to 9:30 AM. Schooling will also be available on Saturday from 6:00 AM to 7:30 AM and Sunday from 7:00 AM to 8:30 AM. It will close 30 minutes before the start of competition and stay open an hour after competition.

LUNGING

Lunging is permitted in the outdoor arena, and in Inspiration arena in the designated area during show hours. Lunging on Sunday morning will be permitted in the warm-up arena from 6:00 AM to 7:00 AM. Lunging will not be permitted in the attached warm up arena.

ARENA AND FOOTING

Sand in both indoor warm-up (70' x 120'') and main show arena (100' x 250'), with a separate (80' X 250') indoor warm-up arena with sand footing. Footing preparation and consulting at Lake Erie College provided by Field Specialties, David Frey.

ARRIVING AT SHOW GROUNDS

Trucks and trailers must use the Pinecrest Road entrance. Stalls will be available on Thursday, April 16th, 2026, at 9 AM. Before unloading your horses, please check in at the Show Office in the Learning Center to provide

your negative Coggins and vaccine records. Proof of a current negative Coggins is required for all horses arriving on the property. Daily haul-in fee applies to all horses on the property without a stall.

SADDLERY AND EQUIPMENT

According to USEF rules.

ATTIRE

Riders are required to show in formal attire. ASTM-SEI-approved helmets are required for all riders.

CREDENTIALS

All exhibitors in any Amateur section must present their Amateur cards at the office before numbers will be released. No numbers will be released until proper credentials and all signatures are in order. Please ensure that your entry form is completed accurately.


FOOD CONCESSION:

Light concessions will be available in the Main EQ lobby through a student group. Hours will be posted at the stand.

OTHER

- Management reserves the right to raise or lower fences, and to cancel or combine classes as competition warrants. In some classes, the area of the courtesy circle may be restricted by a mandatory line. This line will be indicated on the course diagram, and a corresponding barrier will be erected in the ring. All under saddle classes are to be shown at the walk, trot, and canter, both ways of the ring. Light contact with the horse's mouth is required.
- ASTM/SEI-approved headgear is required for all riders and must be worn while mounted
- Lake Erie College and its employees will not be held responsible for loss or damage to persons, property, or horses.
- Smoking is only available in your own personal vehicle. No Smoking in any buildings or stables.
- All dogs must be leashed. Dogs are not permitted in the Learning Center, except for service animals that are properly credentialed. A dog not on a leash will be fined \$50.
- Competition management may fine any individuals, including trainers, owners, exhibitors, or their agents, up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments. Sharps disposal containers are available in the following locations: the wash rack in the border barn, the temporary stall area by the south door (the door facing the arena), and in the middle aisle of the school barn outside the wash racks.



Lake Erie College is committed to the health and safety of our resident horses and all of our visiting competition horses.

To encourage everyone on the premises to use good biosecurity measures to protect our horses, please follow these updated protocols when visiting the Lake Erie College George M. Humphrey Equestrian Center.

DOCUMENTS NEEDED BEFORE THE SHOW:

- **Vaccinations:** All horses must show proof of vaccination for Influenza and Rhinopneumonitis (EHV-1/4) no less than 7 days and no more than 6 months before the show.
 - **Coggins:** All horses must show proof of a negative Coggins test within twelve months.
 - **Trainer/Owner Declaration Form:** This form must be completed and signed by the owner or trainer confirming that the horse has not experienced a fever exceeding 101.5 degrees or any illness leading up to its arrival. The horse must not have been exposed to or treated for any unexplained fever. See the Owner/Trainer Declaration Form for the details.
- Please email these documents to the show manager or show secretary before arriving, or you will be asked to present these documents at the show office before unloading your horse. If you do not have these documents completed in accordance with the protocols, you will be asked to leave the show grounds.**

AT THE SHOW

- Wash and disinfect your hands frequently.
- Do not handle or touch horses other than your own.
- Do not let your horse touch other horses, particularly nose-to-nose.
- Do not share water buckets, feed tubs, tack or other equipment between horses. If using a communal hose to water, do NOT let the hose dip down into the water buckets. Keep the hose end up high when filling your buckets.
- **REQUIRED Temperature Monitoring:** You are required to monitor the temperature of your horse twice a day while on the show grounds. You will be given a card to place on your horse's stall door. Record your horse's temperature twice a day on this card. Keep this card visible on the front of the stall. The Show Manager or designee will be checking these cards. Report any temperature over 101.5 F to the Show Manager. If you fail to comply with this requirement, you will be required to remove your horse from the show grounds.
- All horses should be observed for abnormal clinical signs which may be indicative of a potential infectious disease. Lake Erie College reserves the right to test any horse that has a fever and/or clinical signs for an infectious disease at the owner's expense.

GOING HOME

- Clean and disinfect your tack, boots, equipment and grooming supplies.
- When you get home, shower, blow your nose, wash your hands and put on clean clothes and shoes before going near other horses at home.
- Continue to take your horse's temperature twice daily for 10 days after coming home. Please report any temperature over 101.5 F or illness after returning home to the Show Manager.

We wish all of our competitors and visitors a healthy and safe show here at Lake Erie College!

In the event of any disregard for these protocols, we reserve the right to reject further entries from all related horses and will promptly notify the USEF for potential disciplinary measures. Noncompliance with these protocols may lead to penalties imposed by the USEF on trainers, owners, and competitions that knowingly permit non-compliant horses on the showgrounds.
