RULES & REGULATIONS

Health protocols will be announced prior to the horse show based on changing COVID-19 state, county and city recommendations & guidelines.

ENTRIES

Entries close 5 days prior to each horse show. A post entry fee of \$30.00 per horse will be applied after the closing date. All entry forms should be filled out completely and legibly with one entry per horse and returned to the horse show manager with stall payment. No numbers will be given until the entry is complete and final payment has been made or an open check has been left with the horse show secretary. **NO STALLS WILL BE RESERVED WITHOUT PAYMENT. TRAINERS WILL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR RESERVED STALLS.**

OFFICE HOURS: The office will be open one hour prior to start time each day.

TRAILER-INS: Will be assessed a grounds fee of \$50.00 per day per horse, day stalls available for trailer-ins when possible. Both must be approved ahead of time.

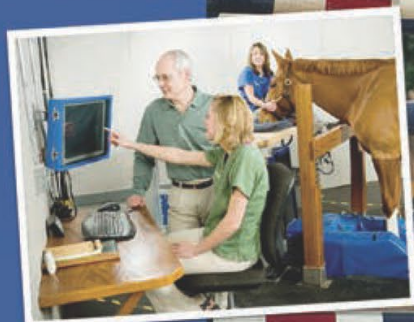
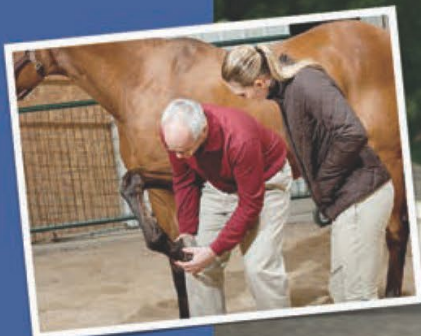
STABLING: Stall Requests **MUST** be made with Horse Show Management. Stall reservations will not be held without full payment. All stalls are temporary, 10' X 10' in size and have doors. No straw bedding will be permitted. **ONLY WOOD SHAVINGS.**

SCRATCHES/NO SHOWS: All scratches must be done in the horse show office. Once the classes have begun **NO REFUNDS** will be given.

NO ADDS WILL BE ACCEPTED ON SHOW DAY - All entries must be done by 3 PM the previous day.

TRAINER SPLITS: Old Seoul Equestrian LLC will allow trainer splits for the purchase of tack stalls, shavings, etc. to be applied to the clients' horse show bill. Trainer splits are due in the horse show office by Noon on Saturday, for weekend shows and Wednesday of Sweet Summertime Before the Derby. Please let your clients know if they should expect splits on their bill. Any splits that are unaccounted for or uncollected by the client will revert to the trainer for payment.

NUMBERS: A number will be assigned to each horse and must be visible on the riders back or saddle pad when in the show ring.

GENERAL RULES

Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current USEF Rule Book will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith. ANY DISCREPANCIES WILL BE DECIDED BY THE JUDGE(S) AND HORSE SHOW MANAGEMENT AND WILL BE CONSIDERED FINAL.

COGGINS: EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 2005 - ALL WISCONSIN EQUINE (HORSES, PONIES, MULES, Etc.) 12 months old and older participating in an advertised equine event ("Advertised equine event" means a show, rodeo, exhibition, trail ride or horse fair, excluding sales or auctions, that is posted or media promoted) must be accompanied by a negative test for equine infectious anemia/E.I.A. (Coggins/CELISA) conducted within the previous 12 months. A health certificate is NOT required for WISCONSIN EQUINES.

USEF/USHJA VACCINE REPORT: Beginning December 1, 2015, all horses entering the grounds of a Federation-licensed competition must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables.

JUMP ORDER: When it is determined that a class is being delayed because horses are not ready to perform, a warning will be given and the exhibitor will have one minute in which to appear at the in-gate or be eliminated. There will be no delays of flat classes for trainer conflicts. All over fences classes can be ridden back to back.

SCHOOLING:

Schooling schedule will be announced prior to the horse show based on changing COVID-19 state, county and city recommendations and guidelines.

USEF RULES AND REGULATIONS will apply to both Hunters and Jumpers during all schooling on the Horse Show Grounds.

PETS: No pets allowed at Seoul Creek Farm.

PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR: ALL RIDERS MUST WEAR ASTM APPROVED HEADGEAR WITH THE HARNESS SECURED AT ALL TIMES WHILE MOUNTED! NO EXCEPTIONS! Any riders failing to comply will be asked to dismount. Failure to comply will result in the entry being disqualified with NO REFUND.

MOTORIZED VEHICLES: Only those with a valid driver's license will be allowed to drive motorized vehicles on the horse show grounds. Anyone in violation will be asked to leave.

- Drinking alcoholic beverages and riding will not be permitted.

GENERAL RULES

MEDICAL WASTE: Sharps MUST be placed on the proper receptacles. RED sharps containers will be placed in the entry of all barns.

THIS SHALL BE THE CONDITION OF ENTRY TO THIS HORSE SHOW AND SHOW GROUNDS.

DAMAGE: All owners and exhibitors shall be held responsible for any damage incurred by them, their agents or employees to stalls, buildings and other properties on the show grounds and will be billed accordingly for any such damage.

AWARDS & RIBBONS: An award and 8 ribbons will be awarded in each class.

Refunds: A NON-REFUNDABLE deposit of \$125.00 is required at the time of entry to reserve stalls. THIS WILL NOT BE REFUNDED UNDER ANY CIRCUMSTANCES. Any additional funds paid before the event may be refunded at the discretion of horse show management. Those seeking a refund must notify horse show management prior to show. If eligible for a refund, a check for the amount of the refund less a \$25.00 office fee

USHJA OUTREACH PROGRAM

The USHJA Outreach Program provides members at any level of membership with an opportunity to earn national recognition in classes from walk/trot to 3'0" in hunter, jumper and equitation sections at rated and local competitions. The program is designed to celebrate riders as they advance through the competitive experience.

Competitors with a USHJA membership (Outreach level or higher) will be eligible to earn year-end awards in their section(s). Year-end awards for each section will be awarded 1st through 6th place by USHJA zone.

In addition to year-end awards, USHJA members (Outreach level or higher) can earn Certificates of Merit throughout the year. Once a rider earns at least 30 points during the competition year, that competitor will receive a Bronze Level Certificate of Merit, at 50 points a Silver Level Certificate of Merit, and at 75 points a Gold Level Certificate of Merit. Bronze Level Certificates will be mailed during the competition year, and all Silver and Gold certificates will be awarded at the end of the competition year.

Outreach competitions may be hosted by any organization meeting the minimum criteria, whether USEF-rated or local, unrecognized competitions.

Any rider may compete in Outreach hunter and jumper classes, but riders wishing to earn points and national recognition, must be USHJA members. USHJA offers a free Outreach Membership. Horses are not required to be registered with USHJA to compete in Outreach classes.

USHJA OUTREACH MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS

- A. Outreach Membership is free. All Outreach class participants must join as a USHJA Outreach member to be eligible for awards.
- B. For Show Official membership requirements, refer to Category 1 and Category 2 specific requirements.
- C. Horses are not required to be registered with USHJA or be microchipped to compete in Outreach classes.

CLASS SECTIONS & POINTS

Hunter Sections

1. All courses must have at least seven jumps and no combinations are allowed. Oxers are discouraged for any class with fences below 2'6". At one day USHJA Outreach Shows, only the first two numbered over fences classes (hunters), regardless of how many classes are held, and one hunter under saddle class in each hunter section will count for USHJA Outreach points. At multiple day USHJA Outreach Shows, only the first three numbered over fences classes, regardless of how many classes are held, and one under saddle class in each hunter section will count for USHJA Outreach points.
 - a. USHJA Outreach Hunters Walk/Trot – Riders may not compete in any over fences classes at the same show. Riders to show at a walk and trot both ways of the ring.
 - b. USHJA Outreach Hunters 18" or Cross rail - Riders must be juniors or amateurs, and may not compete in any class where the fences exceed 2'0" at the same show.
 - c. USHJA Outreach Hunters 2'0" - Riders may not compete in any class where the fences exceed 2'3" at the same show.
 - d. USHJA Outreach Hunters 2'3" - Riders may not compete in any class where fences exceed 2'6" at the same show.
 - e. USHJA Outreach Hunters 2'6" - Riders may not compete in any class where the fences exceed 2'9" at the same show.
 - f. USHJA Outreach Hunters 2'9" – Riders may not compete in any class where the fences exceed 3'0" at the same show
 - g. USHJA Outreach Hunters 3'0" - Riders may not compete in any class where the fences exceed 3'3" at the same show.

—— USHJA OUTREACH CLASS SECTIONS & POINTS ——

Equitation Sections

1. All courses must have at least seven jumps and no combinations are allowed. Oxers are discouraged for any class with fences below 2'6". At one day USHJA Outreach Shows, only the first two numbered over fences classes, regardless of how many classes are held, and one equitation flat class in each equitation section will count for USHJA Outreach points. At multiple day USHJA Outreach Shows, only the first three numbered over fences classes, regardless of how many classes are held, and one flat class in each equitation section will count for USHJA Outreach points. Riders must be juniors or amateurs.

a. USHJA Outreach Equitation Walk/Trot - Riders may not compete in any over fences class at the same show. Riders to show at a walk and trot both ways of the ring.

b. USHJA Outreach W-T-C Equitation – Riders may not compete in any over fences at the same show. Riders to show at a walk, trot, and canter both ways of the ring.

c. USHJA Outreach Equitation 18" or Crossrails - Riders may not compete in any class where the fences exceed 2'0" at the same show.

d. USHJA Outreach Equitation 2'0" - Riders may not compete in any class where the fences exceed 2'3" at the same show.

e. USHJA Outreach Equitation 2'3" - Riders may not compete in any class where fences exceed 2'6" at the same show.

f. USHJA Outreach Equitation 2'6" - Riders may not compete in any class where fences exceed 2'9" at the same show.

g. USHJA Outreach Equitation 2'9" – Riders may not compete in any class where the fences exceed 3'0" at the same show

h. USHJA Outreach Equitation 3'0" - Riders may not compete in any class where the fences exceed 3'3" at the same show.

**May only be offered at Category 1 Outreach competitions*

— USHJA OUTREACH CLASS SECTIONS & POINTS —

Jumper Sections

1. All courses must have at least seven jumps and no combinations are allowed. Oxers are discouraged for any class with fences below .75m. At one day USHJA Outreach Shows, only the first three numbered jumper classes in each section will count for USHJA Outreach points. At multiple day USHJA Outreach Shows, up to four Jumper classes in a section will count for points, with no more than two classes per day counting for points. Show organizers are encouraged to use USEF Jumper Table IV, Sections 1 or 2 (Optimum Time) for scoring USHJA Outreach Jumper classes. The only other tables allowed are Table II, Section 2, a,b,c, or d, and Table II, Section 1. No other USEF Jumper scoring tables are allowed.

a. USHJA Outreach Jumpers .70m - Riders may not compete in any class where the fences exceed .80m at the same show.

b. USHJA Outreach Jumpers .75-.80m - Riders may not compete in any class where the fences exceed .85m at the same show.

c. USHJA Outreach Jumpers .85m- Riders may not compete in any class where the fences exceed .95m at the same show.

d. USHJA Outreach Jumpers .90-.95m - Riders may not compete in any class where the fences exceed 1.0m at the same show.

—— USHJA OUTREACH CLASS SECTIONS & POINTS ——

Points

A. At least three entries must complete the course or class for points to count.

B. Points will accrue through sixth place for any class that has six or more entries. In classes with six or more entries, full points will accrue as follows:

10-6-4-2-1-.05.

5 entries: 6-4-2-1-0.5

4 entries: 4-2-1-0.5

3 entries: 2-1-0.5

C. A rider's home zone will be determined by their place of residence during the current competition year. If a rider changes zones, because of school, work, or otherwise, he must request permission change his home zone to the USHJA in writing in order for his points to follow him. Points will follow the USHJA competition year, December 1 to November 30.

D. USHJA will provide certificates of merit in three categories in each USHJA Outreach section or class.

1. Bronze Level: riders must earn at least 30 points during the competition year.

2. Silver Level: riders must earn at least 50 points during the competition year.

3. Gold Level: riders must earn at least 75 points during the competition year.

4. Certificates will be awarded by zone, and if a zone banquet is held the zone committee is strongly encouraged to present USHJA Outreach certificates during the banquet. Otherwise certificates will be mailed. When a rider achieves Bronze the USHJA will mail the certificate at that time. Presentations of Silver and Gold certificates will be awarded at the end of the year.)

PARA SHOWJUMPING PROGRAM



This year, **Trident Farm** is proud to sponsor the first Para Showjumping High Point Award at Seoul Creek Farm. This is a program open to any and all Para Athletes. The Para Showjumping Program will hopefully be a stepping stone to convincing the International Olympic Committee to recognize and support Para Showjumping as a ParaOlympic sport.

To qualify as a Para Athlete, the rider must have an underlying health condition that leads to an impairment recognized by the World Para Athletics Organization. These impairments include:

- Impaired Muscle Power
- Impaired Passive Range of Motion
- Limb Deficiency
- Ataxia
- Hypertonia
- Athetosis
- Intellectual Impairment

To compete in the Seoul Creek Para Athlete High Point Program, a form must be completed and signed by the Athlete's primary physician or specialist. Points for all Para Athletes will be tallied at the end of the year, and a high point trophy awarded. Athletes may compete in any division that is suited to their riding level. Athletes will not be separated out by severity of impairment at this time.

WARM UPS

Open to any horse or pony. Horse can only be in this class once in a day and the rider must ride horse in the Warm up before a class. Warm up will be open all day. RIDER MUST INFORM GATE PERSON PRIOR TO ENTERING THE RING that the first round will be for the Warm up class. Height will be adjusted for class. Show Management reserves the right to cancel the Warm Up due to time constraints.

GROUND RAIL HUNTER

Open to riders in their first year of showing or riders who have never won a blue ribbon. Riders will retain their eligibility for the entire show season. Riders may only show ground rails, and once riders enter classes with higher jump specifications, riders are immediately ineligible for this division. May only cross enter into the Ground Rail Equitation. No bending lines and no in-and-outs.

BEGINNER RIDER HUNTER 18"

Open to riders in their first year of showing or riders who have never won a blue ribbon. Riders will retain their eligibility for the entire show season. Riders may only show up to 1'9", and once riders enter classes with higher jump specifications, riders are immediately ineligible for this division. May only cross enter into the Beginner Rider Equitation. No bending lines and no in-and-outs.

The division is open to horses or ponies ridden by a junior, 11 years of age and under, who is a beginner rider. Riders in this division may not cross enter into any other WHJA year end award class at the same show except the Short Stirrup Equitation and 11 and under Equitation. No bending lines and no in-and-outs.

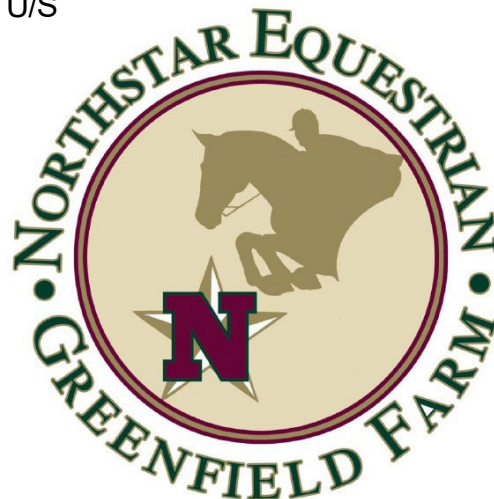

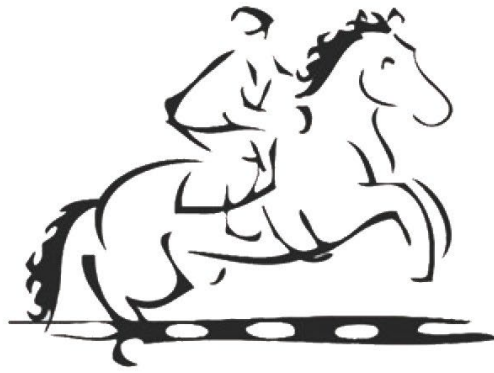
