ADDRESS: 1590 West State Highway 174, Republic, MO 65738

<u>From Republic/HWY 60:</u> Take Highway 174 west from Walmart/Bomgaar's, pass Casey's on Main Street and continue past the water tower, barn is on the left.

<u>From Springfield/East:</u> Take Interstate I44 to Exit 67 HWY N to Republic (left), turn Right at Casey's on to HWY 174, continue past the water tower, barn is on the left.

<u>From the West:</u> Take Interstate I44 to Exit 49 HWY 174 toward Chesapeake/Republic (right), drive 34.5miles, barn is on the left – first drive past Farm Road 67 at the Republic city limits.

COGGINS: Present record of negative coggins (within 365 days of show date) documentation prior to schooling or riding. Upload to online entry, Email: greenvalleymo@gmail.com OR Facebook Message.

SCHOOLING: Ground Poles & Cross-rails
Saturday 7:00-8:00 AM; 20 minute breaks for
18"-2', 2'3" and 2'6"+. Sunday 8-9:00 AM. 18"
& .60m. 20 minute breaks before .70m
and .85-95m

No more than 12 horses in the outdoor arena (or 6 in the covered arena) at one time. We ask that you respect the announcer when they announce that schooling is closing.

BARN RULES: Non-showing horses are permitted, \$10 for the day, same vaccination requirements exist. No riding at speeds above a walk outside of arenas and round pen. All riders on these dates must wear a helmet when mounted. Clean up after your horse in public use areas. Do not share water buckets. Spigots are located around the facility and are free use.



STALLS: Limited number of stalls are available for the day and/or night for \$25/each SPECTATORS: Join us! Bring lawn chairs. NO DOGS. If setting up a tent/canopy, do so BETWEEN Classes / divisions so as not to scare horses on course.

RESTROOMS: There is a restroom located on-site. It is in the "Hay Barn" furthest North (right when facing the barns / towards the road) in the front right corner.

ENTRIES: Classes are \$15 Office fee: \$15 per horse/rider combination. Checks payable to: Green Valley Stables, Cash always accepted, Online payments through horsespot.net subject to appliable fees, Venmo/Paypal: @greenvalleystables \$5 fee for digital payment must be added at time of payment

SCRATCHES: Refunds will be given if notice of scratch is given by 7pm the day before the class. Scratches that are given after this point will not be refunded unless a veterinarian's note is presented.

AWARDS: Award rosette ribbons will be awarded in all classes through 6th place. Champion and Reserve Champion ribbons will be awarded for the first and second place winners for each division. All Leadline class participants will be presented with awards.

SEVERE WEATHER POLICY: When a severe weather warning has been issued, or at the sighting of lighting, the hearing of thunder, or the sighting of other severe weather, the competition will be stopped until at least 30mins have passed without severe weather. Should competition be stopped for lightning, participants should take shelter in a large enclosed structure if possible or in fully enclosed vehicles and stay away from metal or conducting surfaces. Resuming competition will be at the discretion of the show manager, provided at least 30 minutes have passed without severe weather.

101. Leadline - Run between classes, as close to NOON as possible. Must pre-enter. Age 7 and under. Walk only. SMHJA dress code is not enforced, but ASTM approved headgear and boots with a heel mandatory. *Riders cannot show in any other classes at the same show*. To qualify for year end awards, riders must participate in two separate shows.



SMHIA Showing Information

RIDER CLASSIFCATIONS:

Children are riders 17 years old and younger on December first of the previous year.

Adult Amateurs are riders 18 years old and over on December first of the previous year and who do not engage in activities that would classify him/her as a professional per the current USEF Rule Book. Professionals are riders who engage in activities described in the current USEF Rule Book and may compete in open classes.

Rider classification status must be provided on SMHJA membership form.

DRESS CODE: Riders should wear polo type shirt or shirt with collar (small left chest insignia allowed, but no t-shirts), conservative sweaters may also be allowed, breeches or jodhpurs, gloves (optional), and English style riding boots. Conservative colored ASTM approved headgear is mandatory when mounted. Formal hunt attire may be worn without penalty. Spurs of the unrowelled type, crops, and bats are optional. Anyone not conforming to the dress code will not be considered an entry in the class.

HORSES AND RIDERS: Must maintain safe, discipline-appropriate tack and equipment at all times during SMHJA-approved events. Horses and riders may be excused from both competition and schooling during SMHJA-approved horse shows for use of unsafe or inappropriate tack or equipment, per the show manager's discretion. Tack and equipment includes, but is not limited to: discipline-appropriate saddles; legal bits (per USEF guidelines by discipline); appropriately adjusted and maintained tack.

Horses must display appropriate condition and working soundness to compete in SMHJA approved shows. Horses and riders may be excused from competition and schooling based on their body condition and visible soundness, per the show manager's discretion. Points will only be awarded for divisions which have been completed on the show date.
