

Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current USEF Rule Book will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith.

Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above, Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage Competitions, Endurance Rides and Vaulting Competitions: (See GR 828.4 of the Federation rules). Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, or agent, at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass Fee. Participates in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot (exceptions: Friesian performance FR231) and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

FEDERATION ENTRY AGREEMENT

By entering a Federation-licensed Competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaulter or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of the United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (the "Federation") and the local rules of Texas Rose Octoberfest Show (Competition). I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and of the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the Competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cable - casts, broadcasts, internet, film, new media or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR908.4. If not currently a USEF Active Competing member or Subscriber, I acknowledge that I will be enrolled for no cost as a USEF Fan and my USEF Fan Account will continue to annually automatically renew in USEF's sole discretion. Additionally, I acknowledge that the benefits of a USEF Fan are subject to change without notice. USEF may in its sole discretion, at any time, terminate my USEF Fan status. I acknowledge that I may opt out at any time by going to My USEF Dashboard or calling (859) 810-8733. BY SIGNING BELOW, I AGREE that I have read, understand, and agree to be bound by all applicable Federation Bylaws, rules, and policies including the USEF Safe Sport Policy and Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies (MAAPP) as published at www.usef.org, as amended from time to time, as well as all terms and provisions of this Prize List. If I am signing and submitting this Agreement electronically, I acknowledge that my electronic signature shall have the same validity, force and effect as if I affixed my signature by my own hand.

Management reserves the right to limit entries in any class, section or division, to reuse, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries, disqualify any riders or exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries, and cancel award prizes, without any claim for damages; to change any course, to add a dotted line, to cancel or combine any unfilled classes or to reschedule classes after due notice to exhibitors; to change rings and rotate judges; to change specifications in jumper classes as competition warrants. Every horse entered herein for competition will be under the control of the Horse Show Management, but the Show Management will in no case be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the horse show and the officials, employees, directors, officers, sponsoring entries of the horse show and the facilities at which the horse show is held blameless for any loss or accident to his horse(s), employee(s) or equipment which may occur from sickness, fire or other cause. While every effort has been made to avoid mistakes in this publication, the USEF, Texas Rose Horse Park Horse Shows, Texas Rose Horse Park, TRHP, LLC and its management and/or employees assume no liability to anyone for errors. Any significant errors or changes will be disclosed to competitors whose entries are accepted upon their acceptance, and otherwise in accordance with USEF rules.

In case of any action or proceeding brought against Texas Rose Horse Park, TRHP, LL and Texas Rose Octoberfest Show management by reason of such claim Exhibitor, upon notice, covenants to defend such action or proceeding by council acceptable to owner. Exhibitor is responsible for accidents, fire or theft.

THJA MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT THJA Members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at competitions recognized by THJA. A person/horse may register with the THJA at a recognized horse show as long as the application(s) and payment accompanies the official horse show results. Registrations may also be completed online with a credit card at the THJA website before the end of the show. All riders and trainers, in addition to owners of THJA registered horses must be members of THJA for the points to count.

THJA RECOGNITION: The Texas Rose Autumn Festival Show is operated in accordance with the current rules of the Texas Hunter and Jumper Association by which they are recognized and rated "A" in, Performance Hunters 3'3" and 3'6", Green Hunter 3', Green Hunter 3'3", Green Hunter 3'6", Green Hunter 3'9", Amateur Owner Hunters 3'3" and 3'6", Pony, Green Pony, Junior Hunters 3'3" and 3'6", Children's Pony, Children's and Adult Hunter, Modified Adult and Modified Children's, Short, Medium and Long Stirrup Hunters, and JR/AO, Children's and Adult Jumper. Points for placing in Junior, Children's, Pony and Adult Equitation and Opportunity Walk/Trot and Opportunity Cross Rails will be credited in accordance with the rules of THJA.

REMINDER: All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the US Center for SafeSport Training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the US Center SafeSport Code, USEF SafeSport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. More information about these can be found at <u>www.usef.org</u>.

HORSE REGISTRATION: All horses competing in Federation non-breed restricted licensed competitions with hunter, hunter breeding, jumper and hunter seat equitation classes (except those activities numerated in GR901.9, items 1-9) must be properly identified and must obtain a Registration Number from USHJA. A registration number for each horse must be entered on all entry forms for licensed competitions. Proof of registration must be presented to the Show Secretary before numbers can be released. To be eligible for National, Regional or Zone Horse of the Year Awards, and to enter a USEF Computer Ranking List Class horses must also be registered with the USEF. Exception for USEF Computer Ranking List: Citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation need not have USEF Registration.

MICROCHIPS: All horses and ponies must be microchipped in order to be allowed to show. Exempt from this requirement are Walk-Trot and Opportunity entries and those others listed in USEF GR901.

CREDENTIALS: All exhibitors in any pony, pony equitation, Junior Hunter or Amateur section MUST present their credentials (MEASUREMENT CARD OR AMATEUR CERTIFICATION) to the show office before their numbers can be released. Please submit a photocopy of credentials with entry to facilitate processing. All horses or ponies without a valid measurement can be measured at a designated time and place. Anyone not presenting valid membership credentials (USEF/USHJA) will have to :

USHJA: fill out a Show Pass form and will be charged a \$30.00 non-refundable show pass fee . Amateur exhibitors must present valid Amateur Credentials.

USEF: Non-member participants in the role of riders, drivers, handlers, vaulters, lungers, owners, lessees, and agents must pay a Show Pass fee. Competitions cannot accept payment for Show Pass from exhibitors. Show Pass purchases can only be made online on the USEF website by exhibitors.

*Non-member participate in the above roles are limited to obtaining no more than one (1) Show Pass per competition year.

*To be eligible to participate at Federation Licensed Competitions, all persons acting as coaches or trainers, and legal guardians signing entry blanks as coaches or trainers on behalf of their minors must be Senior Active Members in good standing.

*The online Show Pass form is available on the USEF website at <u>www.usef.org/show-pass</u>. The Show Pass form cannot be completed until a competition start date is within the next 7 days or if the show is currently in progress.

ANIMAL WELFARE: We require that all horses be treated with kindness, respect and compassion and should never be subject to mistreatment. Owners, trainers, riders and grooms, or their agents must use reasonable care in the handling and treatment of their horses whether owned or placed in their care for competition or for any other purpose. At all times, while the horse in on the show grounds, we will provide for the continuous well-being of the horse. Abuse and use of whips will be strictly enforced. No poling, use of bamboo off set or excessive use of the whip will be tolerated. The well-being of the horse must be considered above the demands of the breeders, trainers, riders, owners, dealers, organizers, sponsors or officials. Violators may be subject to penalties pursuant to USEF rules. In the event of an acute and serious injury to or illness of a horse on competition grounds when the owner or trainer of the horse or agent of the owner is not present, after reasonable effort to contact that individual has been made, competition management, in consultation with a licensed equine veterinarian, may authorize the provision of emergency veterinary treatment of the horse. If competition management so authorizes treatment under the provisions of this rule, competition management and veterinarian are not liable for any resulting costs, damages, losses, claims or actions arising directly or indirectly from the treatment of the horse.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS: GR845 EQUINE VACCINATION RULE: Horses entering the grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the show grounds. Horses without proper proof of vaccines will not be permitted to enter the show grounds.

HEALTH CERTIFICATES/COGGINS TEST: A Health Certificate dated within 21 days of arrival to be presented when entering the show grounds. CVI must state the horse(s) has not been treated for an elevated temperature or anything related to herd health in the last 21 days. Horses without a Health certificate will not be permitted to enter the show grounds. Texas law requires that each horse be accompanied by a negative EIA certificate dated within one year. Horses without a negative EIA certificate will not be permitted to enter the show grounds.

HORSE SHOW OFFICE

ENTRY CLOSING DATE: Entries close October 10, 2024. Entries must be made by closing date to avoid \$75 late fee.

ENTRIES: Only online entries will be accepted. Enter at <u>horseshowsonline.com</u>. Submitting your entry by the closing date will secure your stall reservation. No numbers will be issued without an open check drawn on a US bank or valid credit card information. Management reserves the right to refuse any entry for any reason. Horses, on the grounds, not entered in any classes must have a completed entry blank on file in the office and will be charged a \$100 non-showing fee per week. Horses not accruing a minimum of \$100 in entry fees will be charged the non-sowing fee in lieu of entry fees. **Warning: Horses that compete in a class in which they are not properly entered will be charged a double entry fee.** The entry form for each horse must included the following:

- Horse name and complete description
- Complete mailing addresses for owner/trainer/riders
- All mandatory signatures, including legal guardian in the case of a minor exhibitor
- All required organization membership numbers, USEF/USHJA horse registration numbers and microchip numbers
- All riders participating in amateur or adult classes must be in possession of current amateur status issued by USEF, or apply for same at show
- Entries/post entries accepted based on stall availability

OFFICE FEE: A \$75 office fee will be charged for every horse on show grounds.

SAFESPORT: All USEF Life and Senior Active Members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirements, to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S Center for SafeSport code, USEF SafeSport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. More information about these can be found at www.usef.org.

ADDS/SCRATCHES: All ADDS/SCRATCHES must be completed online at <u>www.horseshowsonline.com</u> no later than 5:00pm the day prior to the class. Time permitting, same day adds may be accepted at the ingate of each show ring. Scratches will be accepted at any time prior to the start of the class. Any scratches in the Derby after 5:00pm the night prior to the class will incur a \$40 scratch fee.

SUBSTITUTIONS: With a vet's certificate, a new horse may be substituted for a show scratched horse as long as the scratched horse has not shown in any classes and both horses are registered under the same trainer. The scratched horse's fees and stall fee are transferred to the substituted horse with no penalty or charge.

NON-SHOWING HORSES: Horses on the grounds that are not showing in any classes are considered "Non-Showing Horses" and are required to complete an entry blank and pay a \$100 Non-Showing Fee per week. This entitles horse to school in the rings when available, utilize wash racks, etc. Exception – the following horses are exempt from paying the "Non-Showing Horse Fee". 1) In an effort to encourage trainers to bring young horses and get mileage at a reasonable cost, any horses <u>owned</u> by a trainer are exempt; 2) Any horse owners that have actively showing horse may bring one additional "Non-Showing" horse, as long as this additional horse is owned by the same owner, and are exempt. Non-showing horses are only welcome if there are stalls available. In the event stalls are sold out, non-showing horses are not allowed.

TRAINER SPLITS: The horse show offers a service that allows the trainer to split tack stalls. Trainer splits will be accepted until noon Friday (no exceptions) of each show week. Trainers are reminded that this is a service provided by the Horse Show and that doing splits in a timely manner is their responsibility. Additionally, any splits uncollected from the client will revert back to the trainer for payment.

SETTLEMENT OF ACCOUNTS: All show accounts must be closed out at the end of each week. Any open entry accounts will be closed by management and a \$60 processing fee will be added per entry. All questions about show accounts must be addressed within 48 hours of the conclusion of the show. Any mistakes or questions regarding your horse show account and/or prize money must be resolved within 48 hours by contacting the Horse Show Office.

REFUNDS: STALL FEES CANNOT BE REFUNDED AFTER **October 10, 2024.** Entry fees will not be refunded after **October 10, 2024,** unless a certificate of illness or injury prepared by an accredited veterinarian, or doctor's note regarding rider illness/injury, is presented to the secretary before the start of the show. Once the show has started, proper notification of the scratch must be made in the office BEFORE the start of the classes being scratched. In either case the entry fee will be refunded less any nominating fees, stall fee, and office fee of \$65. Refund checks will be sent within 30 days of the conclusion of the show.

RETURNED CHECKS/DISPUTED CREDIT CARDS: A \$50 service fee or 10% of the amount (whichever is greater) will be charged for nonnegotiable checks or credit cards declined/disputed for any reason. Entries for future shows will be declined until funds are paid in full.

CREDIT CARD FEE: A convenience fee of four percent (4%) of the total invoice will be added to all invoices being paid with a credit card.

USEF/USHJA FEES: Current USEF rules relating to drugs and medications will be enforced. Each horse entered must pay the \$15 USEF Drug/Medication Fee plus an \$8 USEF Fee. Each horse entered will also be required to pay the USHJA Fee of \$7. (Total USEF/USHJA Fees \$30)

NOMINATING FEE: Horses competing in all 1.2-meter classes, and above, must pay a nominating fee of \$125. This fee need not be sent in advance and will be charged to your account when you enter a nominated jumper class.

SECTION ENTRY FEE: Once a horse has competed in the first class of an "A" rated hunter section charging a section entry fee, the section entry fee is non-refundable under any circumstances.

NIGHT WATCH FEE: All horses occupying a stall, showing and non-showing, will be required to pay a show night watch fee of \$20. Horses will be checked each night of the show week every 2 hours. This service in NOT optional. USEF rule: HJ107i. Night Watch: Security and monitoring service offered to exhibitors, which must be available to contract at an additional cost, for horses stabled on the grounds.

STALLS: Permanent 12 X 12 stalls of wood/steel construction with doors, and/or temporary 10 X 10 stalls of metal/canvas construction, with clay floor footing, are available for \$250 per week. Move-in is as follows: Texas Rose Octoberfest Show , move-in anytime after 9:00am on Tuesday, April 16th, 2024. No stall doors or panels may be removed. Exhibitors are responsible for damage to stalls. Charges for any damages will be billed to the exhibitor or trainer. Trainers who submit a Block Stabling Request will have stalls assigned based upon entries received. Stall fees are not refundable after the entry closing date and are forfeited as part of the show scratch process. Early move-in or late departures must be arranged in advance at a cost of \$45 per stall per night. Please call 903-882-8696 or email <u>reservations@texasrosehorsepark.com</u> make these arrangements.

GROUNDS FEE: A \$125 Grounds Fee will be charged for all horses not purchasing a stall. Please refer to the Texas Rose Horse Park Top 10 Rules included in this prize list and available at <u>www.texasrosehorsepark.com</u> for more information.

SCHOOLING: Show rings will be open for schooling on the day prior to the show. Time and weather permitting, hunter rings may also be open for schooling after the show each day. Hunter rings will be open for hacking only each morning of the show until 30 minutes prior to their start times (see daily schedule).

TICKETED SCHOOLING: If time and weather permits, management may make ticket schooling available for \$35 per round. Back number and a signed entry blank are required. Time limits may apply.

ATTIRE/HEADGEAR: All riders must be properly attired. Protective headgear must be worn BY ALL RIDERS AT ALL TIMES WHILE MOUNTED, anywhere, anytime on the show grounds. Headgear for all riders must meet or exceed ASTM Standards; must carry the SEI tag; and be properly secured by a harness.

COURSES: Courses will be posted a minimum of one-half hour prior to each class. In Hunter classes, fences will simulate fences found in the hunt field such as brush, wall, in & out, oxer, post and rails, and gates. At management's discretion, a dotted line may be put into effect to restrict the size of the courtesy circle in hunter classes.

JUMPERS: Ties in jumper classes will jump off for first place only. Ties for all other places will be determined by first round time. Champion and Reserve will be determined using the USEF Point system.

JUMP ORDER: Show Management will determine a rotating jump order for all classes over fences. Riders or Trainers with conflicts must see the paddock masters in both rings so that the necessary adjustments can be made.

SHARPS DISPOSAL: Sharps containers will be provided in all barns for the disposal of needles and other disposable sharp instruments. **ALL** items of this nature **MUST** be disposed of in the provided containers. **NO SHARPS** are to disposed of in any receptacle other than the provided sharps containers. **Any individual not in compliance will be subject to a \$100 fine per USEF HJ-107.**

DOGS: Dogs are not permitted to be loose on competition grounds and must be on a leash or otherwise contained. Individuals must not lead dogs on a leash while mounted. **Dog owners are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from their dogs' behavior.** Dog owners failing to comply with this rule may be subject to penalty under Chapters 6 and 7, as well as issuance of warning cards pursuant to rule GR 301. In addition, pursuant to facility regulations. Loose dogs will be removed by animal control, from the show grounds, at the owner's expense.

PARKING: Fire regulations prohibit all vehicles, including trailers, vans and passenger vehicles from being parked in the stable areas. Vans and trailers will be allowed in the stable area only to load and off-load. PARKING AREAS WILL BE DESIGNATED AND VIOLATORS WILL BE TOWED AWAY AT OWNER'S EXPENSE.

RIBBONS/TROPHIES/CHAMPIONSHIPS: All hunter classes receive a trophy and eight ribbons unless otherwise noted. All equitation classes receive a trophy and eight ribbons unless otherwise noted. All jumper classes receive a trophy and eight ribbons unless otherwise noted. Each hunter and jumper section will receive a champion and reserve award based on points unless otherwise noted. Hunter championships will be determined in accordance with USEF HU-11. Jumper championships will be determined on points earned in accordance with USEF JP-110.

PRIZE MONEY: Prize money is indicated for each class. Prize money won can be paid by check or deducted from each horses account. **An IRS W-9 form must be completed in full before any prize money will be paid.** Prize money will be withheld if the recipients Social Security number or EIN number is not on file. Prize money will be payable to the owner unless written authorization, and **complete** alternate payee information, is on file with the show secretary. All prize money will be paid within 30 days of the shows' conclusion.

HUNTER PRIZE MONEY: The total amount of Hunter prize money being offered each week is \$20,000 with a minimum weekly payout of \$5,000. OPERATION OF MOTORIZED VEHICLES: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will **not** be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds of recognized competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described vehicles so long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. **The parent, legal guardian, or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.**

The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or legal guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

PADDOCKS: Paddocks are available, on a first come basis. The cost is \$200 per week. Please reserve in advance on the "TRHP Show Services Form" contained in this publication or on our website <u>www.texasrosehorsepark.com</u>.

TRAINER SPLITS: These shows offer a service that allows trainers to split the bill in the show services office among their clients. Trainer splits must be in by noon Friday each week. Any unpaid balance will revert back to the trainer. Each show must be closed out Sunday, there will be no carry overs to the next week.



All trailers should be dropped in the approved lot and are not allowed to park in the stabling area. Public Parking is in designated areas only.
- 2. CAMPER'S/RV'S/HORSE TRAILERS WITH LIVING SPACE: Must go to campground for hook-up. NO HOOK-UP ALLOWED TO THE BARNS AT ANY TIME! Limited spots available please reserve you space through the TRHP Show Services Office. RV spaces are assigned through TRHP Show Services Office.
- 3. GOLF CARTS/ATV'S: a privilege-not a right-extended to show participants. Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicle, as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent(s), legal guardian(s), or individual who signs the Rental Agreement of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Golf carts can be rented through TRHP show services in the show office. Golf carts are rented on a first come first served bases and TRHP strongly suggests that reservations be made in advanced.
